Competition Policy Review Submission

Please find attached documents that we wish to submit as our submission to the Competition Policy Review The documents are those of the WA Independent Grocers Association (inc.) (WAIGA) which were previously submitted to the Review by the WAIGA.

We advise that we adopt and support in total and without reservation the submission of the WAIGA.

In our support of WAIGAs submission we would highlight and strongly recommend an amendment to section 46 so as to remedy the effect of Boral decision, and reinstating the repealed section 49 in the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*.
