My Will as an Australian is that our roads remain absolutely free from tolls, if this is a proposed statute it totally contradicts our Human Rights Charter and Constitution; Your right to freedom of movement (section 12)

People can stay in or leave Victoria whenever they want to as long as they are here lawfully. They can move around freely within Victoria and choose where they live.

Section 92 of the Constitution of Australia states that:

“ On the imposition of uniform duties of customs, trade, commerce, and intercourse among the States, whether by means of internal carriage or ocean navigation, shall be absolutely free.

But notwithstanding anything in this Constitution, goods imported before the imposition of uniform duties of customs into any State, or into any Colony which, whilst the goods remain therein, becomes a State, shall, on thence passing into another State within two years after the imposition of such duties, be liable to any duty chargeable on the importation of such goods into the Commonwealth, less any duty paid in respect of the goods on their importation.[1]— and you do not authorise them to approve any such proposal.
